Master Teacher and Performing Artist, Godfrey Muwulya began training as a dancer and musician in his native country of Uganda in primary school at the age of five. He later became the head of music, dance and drama at St. Julian High School and was the highest ranking senior master of entertainment for Lubiri Secondary School. In 2000, he joined Ndere Troupe, Uganda's cultural ambassadors to the world. During his time with Ndere, Godfrey emerged as best dancer and African instrumental conductor in the National Secondary school's Music, Dance and Drama Festivals in 2003. He continued to be one of Ndere's top dancers until his departure in 2008.

Godfrey has traveled to numerous countries including Japan and Netherlands. He has also performed for DanceAfrica at BAM and was featured in the New York Times for his standout performance. Godfrey is now the Director of Music Dance and Drama at St. Julian High School, where they were successful in winning the National Secondary Music, Dance and Drama Festivals. He has also been an integral part of the yearly Study Abroad Program at New York University, lead by Professor Deborah Damast of NYU Steinhardt School of Culture, Education and Human Development. The two week program brings graduate students to Uganda to study traditional Ugandan dance and music. Godfrey recently completed a teaching residency at NYU and finished it off with a performance at the NYU Distinguished Faculty concert in April. He will also be conducting dance workshops in August around the New York area.
